SPANISH 3

Yearlong, UC/CSU, A-G Approved, College-Prep Elective (10 Credits)

This course is a continuation, reinforcement and strengthening of the knowledge and skills acquired in Spanish 1 and Spanish 2. Students expand their understanding of the language and communicate expressively.

Students will gain real-life skills such as identifying and describing famous works of art by Hispanic artists, talking about outdoor activities and competitions, expressing belief or doubt about myths and legends from Spanish-speaking countries, and making predictions about the future of our world.
