

Students will...

- Practice speaking by responding to questions in class and by submitting recordings on Canvas
- Read articles, advertisements, recipes, poems, conversations and short stories.
- Write conversations, interviews, letters and short stories.
- Work in groups on projects such as in class skits, videos, comic strip books, food fair and fashion show.


