



WHAT IS ANTHROPOLOGY?

Anthropology is a **semester UC/CSU approved elective** course that will explore what it means to be human and introduce students to the field of Anthropology through an examination of it's three major sub-disciplines.

WHAT KIND OF SKILLS ARE DEVELOPED?

This is a class that focuses on developing **critical thinking** and **logical reasoning** while gaining exposure to concepts essential for the field of study.
