# **Grad Night Frequently Asked Questions**

## 1. When and where is Grad Nite?

Grad Nite is on Friday, June 6th, 2025. It will be at the Disneyland California Adventure Theme Park in Anaheim, California. Students will gather at Northwood High School on Friday, 6/6, for check-in and bag check, exact time will be announced at a later time. They will then board the bus to Disneyland. The event is from 9PM-2AM. Once the event is over, the bus will take us back to Northwood and your students can leave from there.

### 2. Canl drive myself to Grad Nite?

No. Due to strict guidelines from Disney, no students will be allowed to drive on their own. They MUST enter the park via school provided transportation and leave the park the same way. Which also means that the students must stay in the park the entire duration of the event. They will not be able to leave early or arrive late.

#### 3. Will there be other schools at the park?

Yes. Because this is a Grad Nite event hosted by Disneyland Resort, there will be many other high school seniors at the park at the same time.

## 4. Can I invite a friend who is not a Northwood High School student?

No. Due to insurance and liability reasons, you must be a Northwood High School student to attend this event.

#### 5. Can I buy tickets on the day of the event, at check-in?

No. Tickets MUST be purchased by the deadline, March 21, 2025. Tickets will not be sold after this date.

## 6. Can I bring medication?

Medications MUST be in its original bottle/packaging and indicated on the Grad Night Code of Conduct Agreement form signed by the parent/guardian.

#### 7. What do I need to bring?

NHS ID <u>or</u> photo of current ID/Driver's License corroborated with Aeries sign-in on phone.

You CAN bring:

- Phone, camera, keys, appropriate clothing that is comfortable and casual, sweatshirt/jacket (NHS and Disneyland dress code applies)
- SMALL BAGS ONLY!

Students and their belongings will be thoroughly checked when they arrive at NHS and again when they arrive at Disneyland. IPD will be present on Northwood campus and breathalyzer may be used for random inspection. Upon arrival at the park, Disneyland will also conduct screenings which will include bag searches and the use of drug-sniffing canines. We advise students to NOT bring anything that is not necessary.

You CANNOT bring:

- Backpack, large purse, cosmetics, gum, candy, mints
- Glass containers of any size or type including perfume/cologne bottles and reusable water bottles
- Speakers, Musical Instruments, Recreational devices (drones, remote control toys, skateboards, scooters, inline skates, and shoes with built-in wheels)
- Alcoholic beverages and any illegal narcotics/substances.
- Marijuana (or any of its derivatives including marijuana enriched products and medical marijuana), even if it has been legally prescribed to the student or chaperone.
- Self-defense or restraining devices (e.g., pepper spray, mace, tasers, alert noise makers).
- All outside food and drinks that are not factory sealed.
- Firearms, ammunition or weapons of any kind, or objects or toys that appear to be firearms or weapons.
- Fireworks or other similarly explosive and/or flammable objects.
- Laser pointers or any other items we deem inappropriate and/or aligned with normal Resort prohibited items deemed potentially harmful or disruptive, including Bluetooth speakers.
- Smoking, vaping, cigarettes, electronic cigarettes (e-cigarettes), vaping products and any other tobacco products.
- Selfie sticks and hand-held extension poles for cameras and mobile devices.
- Suitcases, bags, coolers or backpacks, with or without wheels that are larger than 24" long x 15" wide x 18" high.
- Folding chairs, with the exception of cane-chair and seat-walker mobility aids.
- Large tripods or monopod stands and professional photography equipment and lighting.
- Attire that we consider inappropriate or attire that could detract from the experience of other Guests, such as clothing containing drug/violence/weapon references or pictures and potential gang-related clothing, as well as costumed masks, helmets, and face paint.
