**Course Description:** Students of all ranges and levels of experience express their ideas through various genres. Through a close analysis of different forms of writing, students create work worthy of being published. Selected work will be featured in a literary magazine. It provides an understanding of the value of written expression, clear and creative communication, and the power of learning from each other and revising. Such skills help students appreciate their own unique personality and gifts, as well as the differences of others that make us all unique and make our world a more enriching environment.

Advanced Creative Writing will need to be able to work more independently and lead group discussions. They should also have experience in writing so they can focus on writing in more sophisticated and purposeful ways. They will also learn how to publish their writing.
