In the event EDL continues beyond April 6, we are preparing to switch gears and jump into full-fledged assignments, assessments, and ultimately grades.

We have many more bugs to work out in the coming days and with everyone working together, we can do this well. We are sensitive to the fact that some are struggling at home with connectivity, new family dynamics, dealing with the learning of several children all at once, as well as many other challenging obstacles. Quarter 3 ends next Wednesday and teachers will be posting up to date grades. Here are a few things to keep in mind in that regard:

- 1. Quarter grades will reflect all content and assessments through the March 13<sup>th</sup>, which was the last day of in-class instruction.
- 2. Quarter grades for almost all classes will basically serve as a progress report. Grades posted are not permanent. If some grades reflect a missing assignment or an upcoming reassessment for mastery, all of that can be remediated later to ultimately impact the overall semester grade.
- 3. Late assignments that can be electronically turned into the teacher can be accepted. Assignments missed due to excused absences ultimately will not be held against you. The grade might be affected temporarily by recent events, however, in regard to the overall semester grade, you will still have time to make up work from excused absences. STUDENTS WITH MISSING ASSIGNEMENTS ARE ENCOURAGED TO SEND IN MAKE-UP WORK ASAP!
- 4. Assessments that need to be made up in person can be made up after the break. We will determine a process for this at a later time.
